Dr. Ami Shah received her medical degree from Stony Brook School of Medicine in 1994 through the seven-year BS/MD program CUNY's Sophie Davis to Stony Brook School of Medicine. She received her Diagnostic Radiology training at The New York Hospital Cornell Medical Center and Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center where she received the Outstanding Resident of the Year Award; 1995 Radiologic Society of North America Introduction to Research Scholarship and was Principal Investigator of the 1998 Society of Thoracic Radiology Research and Education Grant. She currently serves as a Board Certified Radiologist and Director of Mammography at a New York City hospital whose mission it is to serve the underserved and provide compassionate quality



health care regardless of a person's ability to pay. Dr. Shah is also extensively involved in her hospital where she serves on the Medical Executive Committee and Local Governing Council. She has made improvements in Breast Cancer Screening and Lung Cancer Screening while serving on the Quality Improvement committees to improve access to and quality of care received by her patients.

Having held many leadership roles during her career with her involvement in the American Association of Physicians of Indian Origin, American Medical Association and American College of Radiology and the Stony Brook Alumni board. Dr. Shah is currently on the American College of Radiology Commission for Women and Diversity and the ACR Economics Committee on Body Imaging. She has previously been nationally elected to be the voice of more than 85,000 female physicians on the AMA Women Physician Section Governing Council having been nationally elected to serve 4 terms.
