With the cooler temperatures, I think we all feel invigorated and ready for something fresh and exciting. With the changing seasons comes new beginnings. On behalf of the School of Nursing Alumni Board I am extending a warm welcome to Dr. Annette Wysocki as the new Dean of the School of Nursing. We are delighted that Dr. Wysocki is here and look forward to her leadership and enhancement of our school's world-class reputation for excellence in education, research and healthcare.

Since the last edition of this newsletter, I have much to update you with. In the Spring, I was invited to the School of Nursing 9th Annual Scholarship Award Program at the Wang Center Theater. Sixty three students received Academic Excellence awards and Memorial Scholarship funds. I presented the School of Nursing Alumni Board Scholarship Award to three well-deserving recipients. On April 30th, Stony Brook launched the first annual Giving Day to celebrate philanthropy and support need based scholarships. Our goal was to achieve 50 donations to the Nursing Alumni Scholarship Fund. If this was met, in return the Dean of Stony Brook Medicine would gift \$2,500 to our fund. We did it! Please mark your calendars for April 30, 2020. Remember, it is not about the amount of the donation, it is about the number of people who donate. We would love for everyone to participate.

On May 6th, the School of Nursing Alumni board held a breakfast at Stony Brook Medicine to celebrate Nurses' week. Eighty five nurses attended this event which gave them an opportunity to meet and network with their colleagues. We have encouraged our alums to bring a non-alum friend. This gave them the opportunity to experience the great alumni community we have and learned about the incredible programs the SON has to offer. In addition, to wrap up Nurses' week the Alumni board held an "Apps Night" at Miller's Ale House, which was also well received.

I was honored to give the closing remarks at the SON Graduate Convocation in the Staller Center on May 22nd. There were 14 DNP graduates, 22 Advanced Certificate Program graduates, 310 Master of Science graduates and 13 student veterans. I also had the pleasure of hearing Dean Wysocki give the keynote address. In November, the University Alumni Association sponsored an event welcoming Dr. Annette Wysocki as the new Dean of the Stony Brook School of Nursing. We look forward to supporting her in meeting her leadership goals for the future of the School. It is a very exciting time to be a part of the Stony Brook Community!

Transitions in leadership bring opportunities to examine past accomplishments, assess current situations and plan for continued success. Since arriving at Stony Brook University School of Nursing on August 1st, everyone, including faculty, alumni, students and staff, have collectively been working to think about each of these to plan our future success. Undergirding all of these is the essential work of the School of Nursing to advance the science, education and practice of nursing.

As the new Dean, I have been surveying the landscape and am constantly amazed by the level of commitment and loyalty of everyone here. This passion for Stony Brook Nursing is reflected in the accomplishments of our students who consistently passed with high NCLEX pass rates from our undergraduate program ranging from 97 – 98% for 2017 and 2018; and the ranking of our master's online program as #15. The level of expertise among the faculty is recognized not only here at Stony Brook University, but across the nation. Recently, Dr. Terri Cavaliere was recognized as a Fellow of the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners and Dr. Heather Findletar Hines became a Fellow of the American College of Nurse Midwives. And, as I have learned, our students are recognized nationally as recipients of the National Student Nurse Association Stellar Award accomplished under the able leadership of former Dean, Dr. Lee Xippolitos. A five-year badge of recognition!

As we begin our next academic year, we currently have 1,457 students enrolled, 408 undergraduates and 1049 graduate students. We continue to build enrollment in our PhD and DNP programs along with our masters and advanced certificate programs that include nurse midwifery. Education of our students is supported by 38 dedicated standing faculty members, 20 highly committed staff members and more than 100 adjunct faculty members .

It is the collective educational and clinical expertise of the faculty and graduates of our programs that make Stony Brook School of Nursing an excellent place to build the science, education and practice of nursing. Moving forward, we will continue to foster and support our excellent educational programs and direct energy to increase the research intensity of our current faculty and recruit additional new faculty. We just recently posted a call to hire four new research-intensive faculty here in the School of Nursing and invite you to direct qualified individuals to apply for these positions.

Dean Wysocki's Message, continued:

We are also directing effort to continue to build and sustain our partnerships with our clinical supporters here at Stony Brook University Hospital, Northwell, Long Island Community Hospital, Long Island State Veterans Home, and other clinical partners throughout Long Island, the region, state, and nation. I am still learning about many of these facilities as I continue to learn the details of our academic medical center partnerships. These clinical partnerships support the education, clinical placements, research and practice opportunities for our students and faculty. We highly value each of these partners and look forward to continuing to reach out and develop new partners as we continue to build on our history of education, innovation, and community care.

I want to take this opportunity to thank everyone for the warm welcome that I received at the School of Nursing Alumni Dean's welcome reception on November 14th. And to thank everyone who has welcomed me across the Stony Brook campus with warmth and enthusiasm. It is the dedication, passion, and contributions of your time and talent that collectively build a strong community to support the School of Nursing so we can accomplish more and go further to reach new goals. We need your partnership and your support to continue to build on the excellence of the School of Nursing and to secure the future of Stony Brook Nursing.
