## **Sharon Nachman MD '83**

After graduating with her medical degree from Stony Brook School of Medicine in 1983, Dr. Nachman completed her pediatrics training at Schneider Children's Hospital, her Pediatric Infectious Disease fellowship at Lincoln Hospital in the South Bronx, and her training as a Physician Scientist at Rockefeller University, all in NYC. Dr. Nachman has been continually funded by NIH and NICHD since 1992. Her extensive background in Pediatric HIV and it's complications has lead to her current position as chair of the Complications Scientific Committee for the DAIDS funded IMPAACT network (International Maternal Pediatric and Adolescent Clinical Trial).



As a clinician scientist with over 30 years of NIH funding dedicated to developing clinical trials in children and

adolescents, she also serves as Chief of Division of Pediatric Infectious Diseases, Director of the Office of Clinical Trials, and Professor of Pediatrics at Stony Brook Medicine. Dr. Nachman has been involved in the development of numerous clinical trials, including protocol chair and as vice chair. Dr. Sharon Nachman is an international leader in pediatric infectious disease and the treatment of children with AIDS, flu, and measles. She has been the principal investigator of more than 30 clinical trials of promising medicine for patients treated at Stony Brook University Hospital and conducted international trials in the areas of new vaccines, Lyme disease, and AIDS. She also directs the Maternal Child HIV/AIDS Program. Dr. Nachman is often called upon for her expert advice on SARS CoV-2 by local news organizations to answer questions and provide the facts about the vaccines.
